Recyclables accepted at the NTSWA Recycling Centers

Monday-Friday 8am - 4pm & Saturday 8am - Noon



Newspapers

Do not bundle or tie. Keep separate from mixed paper/ magazines and keep dry. Inserts can remain.



Mixed Paper/Magazines

Includes office paper, junk mail, glossy paper, magazines, colored paper, envelopes, coupons, phone books, paper back books, etc. Separate from newspapers and keep dry. Bag shredded paper.



Corrugated Cardboard

Look for the ridges inside the layers of a corrugated cardboard box. Break down boxes and keep dry. No paperboard (cereal, macaroni or tissue boxes, etc.), wax cardboard, or food/ grease soiled cardboard. REMOVE ALL PACKING MATERIALS



Aluminum Cans & Foil

Please empty and rinse your cans. Thoroughly clean foil, NO FOOD RESIDUE. Crushing cans is optional, but saves space.



Steel or "Bimetal" Cans

Rinse cans well and secure the lid inside. NO FOOD RESIDUE. Labels can remain.



Glass Bottles and Jars

Separate glass bottles and jars by color; clear, brown, and green. <u>Food and</u> <u>beverage containers only.</u> NO FOOD RESIDUE. Remove all lids and rings and rinse well. Labels can remain.

Windows, light bulbs, windshields and cookware are all made of a different type of glass and are <u>not accepted</u>.



Plastics Bottles, Jugs, Jars & Tubs

RECYCLE PLASTICS BY SHAPE,

NOT BY THE #.

Includes soda and water bottles, milk jugs, laundry jugs, shampoo bottles, yogurt containers, and butter tubs. Rinse well, NO FOOD RESIDUE, labels and caps <u>can</u> remain.

Crushing your plastic containers helps to save collection space. It is acceptable to bag plastics for curbside collection.

NO STYROFOAM, NO OIL CONTAINERS,

NO BULKY/HARD OR RIGID PLASTICS, NO FLOWER POTS, NO BLACK PLASTIC, NO PLASTIC BAGS, NO CLAMSHELLS, NO MICROWAVE TRAYS, NO BAKERY CONTAINERS, NO PLASTIC PACKAGING, NO TAKEOUT CONTAINERS, NO TOYS, NO HANGERS, NO PLASTIC FURNITURE

Electronics



Only accepted during scheduled collection events. Fees may apply. Contact NTSWA or visit NTSWA.org for a schedule and list of accepted materials.



Clothing & Textiles

All clean gently used clothing, nylon curtains, drapes, towels, sheets, hats, belts, paired socks and shoes. Place in a heavy duty bag.

Unable to accept wet/dirty clothing, rugs, and foam backed drapes.



Used Motor Oil & Antifreeze

Bring in motor oil and antifreeze in tightly sealed, sturdy, labeled containers that can be left at the site. Materials <u>CAN NOT</u> be mixed together or mixed with water or any other materials. Residents only. <u>MUST BE</u>

IN A CONTAINER NOT TO EXCEED 5 gal.



Batteries

Lead acid and rechargeable batteries accepted only.

Appliances

Accepted for recycling, fees apply.

How does recycling benefit us?

- Conserve Natural Resources
- Conserve Energy

- Reduce the potential for pollution

Why do I need to separate?

Source separation is key to our great program. In five minutes per day or less, the average resident can properly prepare and separate their recyclables. Do so by placing materials into bins or bags. By keeping your materials separated into the correct categories, you have already begun to process the materials for a recycling manufacturer.

How do I " Close the Loop"?

By buying products that are recyclable, you can enjoy the benefits listed above. If you buy products made from recycled materials, you are sustaining the closed loop system of recycling and creating a demand for recycled products. Look for products packaged in "post-consumer" recycled materials. These have already been through the "Loop"!
